





### **Chitty Chitty Bang Bang**

Fairytales, Myths, Legends, Magic and Mystery, from Homer (The Odyssey, not The Simpsons), The Arabian Nights, through The Brothers Grimm, Tolkien and beyond, these have been my stalwarts and constant companions from my earliest discoveries of the wonder of reading, right throughout my life. As a shy, bookish child, they were my escape to faraway worlds full of adventure, and excitement.

In my childhood, TV's (for those fortunate to own one!) were in black and white, you had to raise yourself from the lounge to turn them on and off and to change the channel, videos/CD's, ipods, ipads, mobile phones, all non existent, computers existed only in the realms of science fiction and tablets were something you took for a headache!

A trip to the cinema was a rare and special treat. And that was where I first fell in love with Chitty Chitty Bang Bang.

I remember the joy at seeing the Potts' Windmill house with its crazy interior and wacky breakfast making machine, I loved Grandpa Potts and his "trips to India", Truly in her beautiful clothes and fancy car, was terrified by the Childcatcher, shouting out loud to Jeremy and Jemima not to be fooled into leaving the Toymaker's cottage, and of course, the star herself, Chitty Chitty Bang Bang. I had the soundtrack on vinyl, playing it until it was just a series of scratches and blips.

Well, you can only imagine how excited I was when I was told that the rights for the live version were available. I didn't pause for thought (a lifelong condition!), just said "yes PLEASE!".

Never, in a million, trillion years did I really believe it would happen. But it did. And I'm not sure exactly how, but I'm determined to do this amazing, enchanting story justice, with a local cast, in our little theatre.

Obviously I'll be looking for people who can sing and act, but mostly, I want people who want to have fun. People with personality and enthusiasm, love of entertaining and capacity for extreme silliness. I have decided to make several roles non gender specific, but be guaranteed (warned!), everyone will be kept very busy!

I have no lofty ambitions to "high art", "motivation" or "subtext", I want to create two and a half hours of pure, unadulterated escapism, that the very young to the very ancient will enjoy in equal measure, and I welcome everyone who would like to join me on this rollercoaster, to come and audition.

Although the emphasis is on fun, please also consider that it will be a lot of hard work and commitment.

For those with a multitude of extra- curricular activities (adults and children), I would require that you make this production your number one priority for the duration of the rehearsal period, and I don't say this lightly.

Please think about this BEFORE auditioning. There will be 3 rehearsals per week (two evening, one weekend), and although not everyone will be called to each one, you must be available if required.

I make every effort to only call people I need, and I like to work them to the bone! (Kind of kidding).

## Chitty Chitty Bang Bang - So What's it About?

Surprisingly enough, there are still some people who have never seen the MGM movie based on Ian Fleming's book, and even fewer people who have seen it on stage. So what's it about?

The story is set in the early 1900's, and it's central characters are the widowed Caractacus Potts, an eccentric, not so successful inventor, his two children, Jeremy and Jemima, and his father, the equally eccentric Grandpa Potts, all living in genteel poverty in a windmill.

The children fall in love with an old racing car, now languishing in a nearby junkyard, and convince their father to save it from the scrapheap and restore it to its former glory.

Unbeknownst to them, Baron Bomburst from Vulgaria, also wants to get his hands on the car, and is aided and abetted by the magnificently evil, child hating Baroness Bomburst and his two sinister henchmen Boris and Goran.

Meanwhile, the Potts family encounter the deliciously named Truly Scrumptious, the suffragette daughter of wealthy Lord Scrumptious, owner of the Scrumptious Sweet Factory, and once the car, now known as Chitty Chitty Bang Bang, has been restored by Caractacus, the children invite her to join them in a picnic by the seaside.

Little do they know that Chitty is no ordinary car, but possesses magical powers that will sail them across the sea and propel them through the air, all the way to Vulgaria, on a quest to save Grandpa Potts who, having been mistaken for his son, has been kidnapped, brought before the Baron and Baroness, and given 24 hours to convert the Baron's ancient car into one with float/fly features.



Once in Vulgaria, the children are captured by the villainous Child-catcher, and Caractacus and Truly team up with the good hearted Toymaker, staging an elaborate birthday surprise for the Baron, culminating in freedom for all!

Vulgarians rejoice, Grandpa joins Boris and Goran in a hot air balloon adventure to Alaska, Truly and Caractacus declare their love for one another, and all break into song! (Actually this happens throughout the show at random times!)

### Chitty Chitty Bang Bang - Characters and Vocal Ranges

**CARACTACUS POTTS:** An eccentric English inventor, a loving father and son. His inventions and children are his life. Male, Not age specific but must look 35+

Range: A3 - G5

**TRULY SCRUMPTIOUS:** Daughter of the famous candy maker, Lord Scrumptious. Strong and independent, but gentle. Falls in love with Caractacus.

Female, Not age specific but should look 25+

Range: A3 - E5

JEMIMA POTTS: Caractacus's daughter. She is an adventurous, loving girl with a vivid imagination. Female, 8-13 yrs

Range: C4 - E5

**JEREMY POTTS:** Caractacus's son. An adventurous but sweet boy with a vivid imagination. Male, 8-13yrs

Range: C4 - E5

**GRANDPA POTTS:** Caractacus Potts' father, a war hero who loves to tell old war stories to Jeremy and Jemima.

Male, Not age specific, should look over 55

Range: C4 - E5

**BARON BOMBURST:** Tyrannical ruler of Vulgaria and a lover of toys. A man-child, he is very immature, needy, and whiney.

Male, Not age specific, should look 40+

Range: E4 - E5

BARONESS BOMBURST: Tyrannical and dramatic, hates children. Female, Not age specific, should look 40+

Range: G3 - G5

THE CHILD-CATCHER: Sinister and wheedling, determined to keep Vulgaria child-free. Not age or gender specific.

Could also be in ensemble

THE TOYMAKER: With all children outlawed in Vulgaria, this toy-making genius makes toys only for the child-like

Baron. Smart but frightened. Not age or gender specific

Range: C4 - E5

BORIS & GORAN: Vulgarian spies. Not very bright. Not gender or age specific

Range: C4 - G5 (Boris) D4 - G5 (Goran)

LORD SCRUMPTIOUS: Owner of the Scrumptious Sweet Factory. Extremely busy and self-important.

Male, Must look 55+. Could also be in Ensemble

Many featured roles: Miss Phillips (Receptionist Sweet Factory), Coggins (Junkman), Sid & Violet (fairground couple)

Ensemble (including children): Children, Morris Men (and women), Soldiers, Inventors, Vulgarians, English Crowd
