There are plenty of quirky and fun lead and supporting roles up for grabs and we made sure that every single cast member will receive their chance to shine. But don't worry, we are welcoming people of all skill levels - the main thing is that you have enthusiasm and are motivated, so that we can all enjoy the rehearsal process!

To all those talented dancers who don't like to sing on stage - listen up! You will get to show off your moves as part of our dance-only squad; that's right, no singing necessary. Of course all the singing enthusiasts are also well catered for as part of our principal cast or ensemble! Ensemble people - be prepared to take on several small roles during the show!

This production also represents a fantastic opportunity for CHMCC to encourage cultural diversity. This time around we especially invite performers of African, Aboriginal or Indian descent to audition, as we are in need of Soul!

So if you think you would be perfect to represent the "coloured" and "hip" inhabitants of Baltimore (or if you know anyone who can share his/her soulful voice and sleek moves with the Coffs Harbour audiences – please spread the news!), pick up your courage and join us for auditions – we really don't bite and would be more than happy to meet you! Overall, there will be plenty of Swinging 60s music, infectious dancing & plenty of fun times with our cast and production team, yay!

The auditions will include a quick dance audition for all roles, so make sure you arrive on time. Don't be scared though, it will be a very relaxed warm-up and group bonding;)

You don't need to prepare anything, as you will learn some simple steps to put your own groove on. Only those who wish to audition for dance-only roles will have to prepare a solo dance number.

We will also provide audition packages for those who are interested, which will contain songs of the show and some dialogue extracts you can use to get familiar with the characters (especially helpful for people who don't like to read cold and want to prepare).

Watching the Hairspray movie by Adam Shankman (2007) can be great to get you familiar with the characters and the general spirit of the show. However, keep in mind that the film differs in many aspects from the stage production. If you would like to check out the two songs that are not in the movie, go to YouTube and do a search for "Mama, I'm a big girl now" and "The Big Dollhouse".



Set in Baltimore in 1962, 'Hairspray' grabs the audience right away with possibly one of the best opening numbers in musical theatre: "Good Morning Baltimore", in which we meet our heroine, Tracy Turnblad, a pleasantly plump teenager with big hair and a bigger voice, who loves to dance, and dreams of being a star.

Tracy and her best friend Penny are big fans of 'The Corny Collins Show', a teenage dance TV show, but it's only for white kids; we are still in the days of segregation and the coloured kids get their own 'Negro Day' once a month.

The story is not just one more teenage romance, but has a serious message, as the kids demand an end to racial segregation and try to drag Baltimore, and their parents into the 60's. It's also a story any kid who has ever thought their parents were hopelessly old-fashioned can identify with!

There are also some fabulous roles for people who don't normally fall into the leading man/leading lady formula: girls who don't have to be skinny, boys who don't have to be white, men who don't have to be handsome, and a young girl with the biggest voice of them all!

Tracy's mother Edna is a large, shy woman who takes in laundry for a living and hasn't been out of the house since the 50's, but Tracy's dad Wilbur, who runs the local joke shop, loves her anyway. One of the most heart warming numbers in the show comes when mother and daughter get the full 60's makeover in "Welcome to the 60's".

Other characters include Penny's uptight mother, Prudy, who berates Penny for listening to "coloured music" and the teen star of the show, Amber, and her ambitious mother Velma. All three girls argue with their mothers in another rousing number: "Mama I'm a Big Girl Now".

Tracy's love interest is Link, a teenage heart-throb, and Tracy is already daydreaming about marrying him in the next of her big numbers, "I Can Hear the Bells".

When Tracy auditions for 'The Corny Collins Show', Velma and the 'nice white kids' who make up the show's regular dancers make fun of Tracy due to her weight, and when Tracy states that she's in favour of racial integration, they are horrified.

There is also a chorus of non-white kids, led by a boy with the unlikely name of Seaweed, who ends up

falling in love with Penny. Other non-white roles include Seaweed's mother, the larger than life Maybelle, and his sister, Lil Inez, who was rejected at the auditions, despite being the best singer and dancer there.

The second act opens with the entire female cast in jail after a protest in favour of racial integration goes wrong. When Edna is released, Wilbur and Edna comfort each other, in a cute little duet (made extremely comical by the fact that Edna is usually played by a man in drag), "You're Timeless to Me".

When the kids are variously released, rescued or escape, they determine to sneak their coloured friends onto the set of the Corny Collins Show. After various shenanigans, the story ends with the entire cast on the set, Edna popping out of a giant hairspray can, and Tracy being crowned Miss Teenage Hairspray 1962, and a big ensemble number, "You Can't Stop the Beat", in a huge feel-good ending. Shouldn't be too hard, right??

The movie poster above will give you some idea of the characters, and the movie is just wonderful! (Yes, that is John Travolta in the blue outfit!)

Hairspray is a big, bold, brightly coloured feel-good show, with some great 60's music and big dance numbers. However, it is more than just tinsel, as it will hopefully make the audience, and indeed, everyone involved, think twice about how we accept people who are just that little bit different.

We hope we can encourage members of different ethnic backgrounds in our community to get involved, and start with a little racial integration of our own! If you, or someone you know is Aboriginal, or comes from one of our refugee communities, perhaps you could start talking to them about this show, and spread the word.

We're pretty excited about Hairspray!

HAIRSPRAY - Characters and Vocal Ranges

Tracy Turnblad - A "pleasantly plump" teenager, who dreams of fame and fights to racially integrate The Corny Collins Show. Enthusiastic, confident but with a naive, lovable personality. Females of all body sizes will be considered. Dancing required. Vocal Range: Mezzo belter, G below middle C to E above C. Age: 14 - 20.

Edna Turnblad - Tracy's kind, plus-sized mother - this is a drag role. Edna runs a laundry business from her home, and shy and conscious of her weight, she hasn't been out in years. A loving housewife, sincere, not campy. Dance requirement (low difficulty). Vocal range: Tenor: F below middle C to E above C. Age: 35 - 50. Could be played by a woman if necessary.

Amber Von Tussle - Spoiled mommy's girl, the resident princess of The Corny Collins Show. She has a mean streak and is willing to do anything to win the Miss Teenage Hairspray pageant. Dancing required.

Vocal range: Belt: middle C to F above C. Age: 15 - 20

Velma Von Tussle - A former beauty queen, Amber's scheming mother and producer of The Corny Collins Show. She wants to make sure Amber wins Miss Teenage Hairspray. Attractive, slim, but controlling, ambitious and ruthless. Dancing required.

Vocal range: Belt: G below middle C to E above C. Age: 30 - 50

Penny Pingleton - Tracy's slightly dorky best friend. A funny & likeable character, Penny falls for Seaweed. Dance requirement. Vocal range: Belt: middle C to G above C. Age: 14 - 20

Link Larkin - A teenage heartthrob and one of The Corny Collins Show dancers, was dating Amber but falls for Tracy. Vocal range: Baritone: E below middle C to G above middle C. Age: 18 - 22.

Motormouth Maybelle - The owner of a downtown record shop and the host of "Negro Day" on The Corny Collins Show, self-described as "big, blonde and beautiful". Seaweed and Little Inez's mother. Confident and inspiring mover for racial integration, a big voice with a strong but kind personality. Non-white ethnicity.

Vocal range: Alto: A below middle C to E above C. Age: 35 - 50

Seaweed Stubbs - A hip "Negro Day" dancer and the son of Motormouth Maybelle who falls in love with Penny. Cool, attractive, friendly and welcoming to all. Non-white ethnicity.

Vocal range: Tenor: G below middle C to B above middle C. Age: 15 - 21

Wilbur Turnblad - Tracy's quirky, loving father, he owns a joke shop and is still madly in love with his wife, Edna.

Vocal range: Baritone: G below C to E above middle C. Age: 40 - 55. Low difficulty dance requirement.

Corny Collins - The charming, slick and confident host of The Corny Collins Show, he's a local celebrity with sex appeal.

Vocal range: Tenor: D below middle C to above middle C. Age: 25-45, dance ability a big advantage.

Little Inez - Seaweed's younger sister, who tries to audition for The Corny Collins Show but is turned away because she is black. Needs to be a strong singer and dancer, a young talent with an eager and excited nature. Non-white ethnicity.

Vocal range: Belt: middle C to E above C. Age: 12 - 18

Other female roles - The Matron guarding The Big Dollhouse (45-60); the Gym Teacher (45-60); and Prudy Pingleton, Penny's overprotective and narrow-minded mother. Could be played by one or more actors.

Vocal Ranges: A below middle C to G above middle C.

Other male roles - Mr. Pinky (50-60), owner of Mr. Pinky's Hefty Hideaway; the Principal of Tracy's High School (40-50); and Mr. Spritzer (50-60), the President of Ultra Clutch Hairspray.

Seaweed's friends - Talented dancers and/or singers with a passionate and fun attitude. Non-white ethnicity.

2-3 females, 1-3 males, age range 16-20 (or look as though you could be). Any vocal range.

The Dynamites/The Pinkets - 3 -4 sassy singer/dancers, inspired by the Supremes. Tight harmony, soulful girl group singers.

Vocal Range: G below middle C to A above C. Non-white ethnicity, double as Seaweed's friends if necessary.

The Corny Collins Dancers - Talented dancers with a passionate and fun attitude. Singing not a necessary requirement, but welcomed. 1-2 males and 2-4 females, age range 16-20 (or look as though you could be). Any vocal range.

Ensemble: high school students, Baltimore residents, policemen, prison guards. Various ages and vocal ranges.

* Ensemble roles may include speaking parts.
