




This way we will see each dog one at a time in a casual and relaxed environment.


We will have more information for everyone interested in auditioning within the April newsletter so please be sure to keep an eye out and in the meantime, spread the word!

OUT OF THE CLOSET

Anyone who has been down to the sheds lately will appreciate the huge improvement now that CHATS and CHMCC have consolidated their costumes into the one shed. A huge thank you to CHATS for their co-operation in this venture and in particular to Louwanna Kaur, who has put in outstanding work to assist in the organization. She is one hard working and delightful lady and we now have access to a far greater variety of costumes for both companies.

Lou and I have been working together recently to attempt to sort them all into categories but this will take quiet a bit of work, realistically I am guessing about 6-12 months. Ideally once we have them sorted we will begin a huge cull to remove some of the duplications and anything we can readily access from second hand shops etc. At that point we hope to be able to form a catalogue which will make it so much easier when costuming a show and possibly give us the opportunity to assist other companies by hiring out from our stock.

As everyone will appreciate our costumes are a valuable resource for both companies and save us considerable funds when producing a show. With this in mind we have instituted a policy that no costume will leave the shed unless it has been approved by Lou or me and listed and signed for in the large red book which is located at the shed.

Please make sure you contact us if there is anything you wish to borrow. For individual loans it is important to stress that the costumes must be returned in a cleaned state and in the condition it was received in. All costumes must be signed off in the book on return. There are no exceptions to this rule.

This policy will also apply to company shows, however whilst CHMCC have undertaken the cleaning of costumes, each individual involved in shows is responsible to ensure that every piece of costume issued to them is returned in good order.

A big thank you should also go to Anne Poidevin who has been assisting with repairs and alterations to costumes. Anne has also created guidelines for borrowers to advise of any alterations or additions that will be permitted to borrowers. Once again another very hard working lady.

Good news from Colin Wilkes (who is doing costumes for Annie) to say that he has virtually costumed the whole show so now cast can concentrate on that awful job of getting lines down. Well done Colin!

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Committee Business



We thought it would be a good idea to write a little piece each month to let you know what's been happening in committee.

Currently, CHMCC President Maureen Burgess has taken a sabbatical, and Vice President Jenny Beatson is Acting President. I'm sure you'll agree that Maureen has worked tirelessly for the Company for many years, and fully deserves a break. Committee member Donna Fairall has stepped down to concentrate her

energies on directing 'Annie', a not unreasonable request!

In the last two months, the committee has been receiving the final financials for 'The Secret Garden', and it looks like the show came in under budget, and has made a small profit. David Tune, the show's director, proposed donating a small percentage of the profits to the Can Do Cancer Trust, and this proposal was accepted.

We have also been working on putting together a handbook which will eventually contain the up-to-date constitution, updated by-laws, and various policies and procedures in one place, such as codes of conduct, audition guidelines and policies, working with children policies, etc etc. We hope this will provide a valuable resource to any future committee members, as well as enabling us to be clear and consistent on what our policies are.

Some committee members are working on the production side of 'Annie', and others are also starting to plan for 'Hairspray'. Still others are starting to think about a program for 2015! Soon we will also start planning for a bush dance in midwinter and the AGM in August. Plenty to be getting on with!
