





The Secret Garden

About seventeen years ago my wife Dee persuaded me to see the professional stage production of "The Secret Garden", I say persuaded as I was reluctant to go, having a perception that this was something of a 'girls' musical.

How wrong I was, I came away thinking that this was probably the best musical I had ever seen, and the impact it had has been with me ever since.

Based on the well-known book of the same name by Francis Hodgson Burnett and bought to the stage by Marsha Norman and Lucy Simon (sister of Carly Simon), this show presents a depth of emotion that I have seldom experienced from a stage production at any level.

I have always believed that music is the perfect vehicle for emotion, and through such powerful and beautifully evocative songs as "Hold On", "Lily's Eyes", "I Heard Someone Crying", "How Could I Ever Know" and "Wick", just to mention a few, the story captures your heart.

This musical is vocally demanding, requiring both technique and discipline from all performers. It offers challenges to both principals and ensemble through its complex layered harmonies and the emotional tones required.

There are opportunities for many people to shine in this show, with a cast of over twenty performers including two roles for young singer/actors (I intend to double cast both of these parts), and a large workload for the ensemble (most are on stage for over half the show), as well as multiple male and female principal roles.



There are no DVD's of this musical that I am aware of, and the stage production differs from both the book and the movie/s in many ways, meaning that we will be creating a very unique production together.

The Secret Garden

This enchanting classic of children's literature is brought to life as a musical by composer Lucy Simon and Mary's past wander the halls and the Pullitzer Prize-winning playwright, Marsha Norman. The show premiered in London in 1991, and won 3 Tony awards, including one for the 11 year old Daisy Eagan as Mary Lennox.

Orphaned in India, 11 year old Mary arrives in Yorkshire as the ward of her strange, embittered uncle, who still longs for his long-dead wife.

The huge empty house has a sad history, and holds a secret. Ghosts from cousin Colin, the children, both gardens, and many of the initial haunting melodies are sung by these spirits, or dreamers.

Left largely alone, except for the company of Martha, a warm-hearted Yorkshire housemaid, Mary turns to the Spring is seen alongside the new life garden and grounds, making friends with the gardener, and a strange boy, Dickon, who can charm all manner of birds and creatures, shows her how to bring life to the neglected garden.

When Mary meets her invalid motherless, are a comfort to each other and become firm friends. Mary introduces Colin to Dickon, and the secret garden, and the children learn how to love and laugh again.

The awakening of the garden in Mary brings to both Colin and his father, changing their lives forever, and bringing them together in the touching finale.
